Resolution

- Resolution authorizing an interlocal agreement for participation in the Minnesota Multistate Contracting Alliance for Pharmacy (MMCAP), a National Cooperative Group Purchasing Organization, pursuant to the Texas Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code, for purchases of pharmaceuticals and healthcare products for the Corpus Christi-Nueces County Public Health District.
- MMCAP Infuse is a free national group purchasing organization for government run health care facilities and provides:
 - Discounted pricing on pharmaceuticals and medical supplies
 - Streamlines purchasing
 - Improves cost efficiency through group buying power



Background & Summary

- Historically, CCNCPHD obtained vaccines through individual contracts, competitive bidding, or retail/wholesale purchases, which required significant administrative time for vendor vetting and compliance.
- By joining MMCAP Infuse, the CCNCPHD gains access to nationally negotiated, competitively priced contracts, reducing costs, simplifying procurement, and ensuring reliable access to essential pharmaceuticals and medical supplies.
- MMCAP Infuse enhances the department's ability to provide consistent, cost-effective public health services by:
 - Improving efficiency
 - Reducing administrative burden
 - Strengthening operational readiness
 - Preventing shortages during outbreaks or emergencies



Fiscal Impact and Staff Recommendation

Fiscal Impact

- There is no fiscal impact as MMCAP membership participation as membership is free.
