Acceptance of Two 2023 Texas Defense Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant (DEAAG) in an amount of \$1,000,000 For the Perimeter fencing Project & \$175,000 for Two Portable Solar-Powered Electric Vehicle Charging Stations



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DEAAG Overview

- On May 9, 2023, the Council approved the application for two grants from the DEAAG Program offered to Texas Military Installations by the Texas Military Preparedness Commission on behalf of Naval Air Station Corpus Christi (NAS-CC) and the Corpus Christi Army Depot (CCAD).
- On June 22, 2023, the City received notice that a grant for \$1,000,000 had been awarded to NAS-CC for partial replacement of their perimeter fence, and \$175,000 had been awarded to CCAD for new solar-powered electric vehicle charging stations.
- NAS-CC and the Corpus Christi Army Depot (CCAD) employ almost 11,000 people and financially contribute over \$4.7 billion to the Corpus Christi economy. These projects were identified by NAS-CC and CCAD as priorities to sustain their mission.
- Construction will begin in January 2024 and end in December 2024.



NAS-CC Project

Scalable force protection project to replace approximately 13,500 linear feet of perimeter fence and two manual gates to prevent unauthorized entry into protected areas, and to modernize security fencing to comply with current U.S. Department of Defense Antiterrorism and Force Protection standards.

- These complement the two additional stations secured by CCAD.
