South Texas Military Task Force Activity Report to the City of Corpus Christi

July to December 2022

Attended NASCC Change of Command Ceremony in which CAPT Chris Jason handed command over to CAPT Ty Jurica

Sent out news update that former CCAD Commander, Gail Atkins was promoted to Brigadier General! Sent note of congratulations to BG Atkins.

Assisted Mayor's Chief of Staff with updated email addresses of area Commanders for invitations to Mayor's "Big Bang" 4th of July Event.

Met with Rob McDonald, Director of the area Metropolitan Planning Office to check for any conflicts with the planned course for the Conquer the Coast Bike Ride on 17 September. Rob has lots of experience in military aviation/communities especially in developing JLUS. Rob offered to provide a short overview of the Corpus Christi Metropolitan Planning Organization at our next Quarterly Meeting scheduled for 17 August at 8:00 am.

Received and reviewed Texas Governor's report prepared by the Texas Military Preparedness Commission. Latest annual economic impact of Corpus Christi Army Depot, 9,344 jobs, \$1.4B, Naval Air Station Corpus Christi, 19,815 jobs, \$3.4B; Naval Air Station Kingsville, 4,442 jobs, \$752M.

Met with and thanked military personnel performing (IRT) Innovative Readiness Training for Nueces County. These Army and Marine personnel provided key services such as healthcare, construction, transportation and cybersecurity at no cost to the county.

Updated and prepared 1) Fact sheets on CCAD and NASCC, 2) Fact sheet on USCG- Corpus Christi Sector, 3) Announcement of NASCC's 2022 Commander in Chief Installation Excellence Award.

Attended meeting of the Governors Committee to Support the Military to prepare legislative recommendations for the upcoming Texas session.

At the request of USCG-CC Sector Commander, forwarded information on the Customs/Border Protection Aerostat Prototype Testing in South Texas. This detection platform earned a reputation as a gamechanger against border security threats including illegal fishing, drug and human smuggling, and other illicit activity.

Attended Change of Command for Chief of Naval Air Training. At the request of CNATRA, obtained and provided text of the City Commendation to RDML Westendorff.

Sent contact info of new Area Military Commanders to Tammy E. to assist in invites to State of the City.

Purchased a table for State of the City and sent invitations to local TRAWING Commanders, CO of MATSG-22, CCAD Deputy to the Commander, and Kingsville NAS Commanding Officer.

Contacted Chief of Naval Air Training, to inquire which printer they used for their recent Change of Command brochure. The same type of brochure was requested by the Mayor's Office for State of the City.

The Bend magazine is focusing the next issue of the Bend Business magazine on the military, its importance to our community, and local military veterans who are prominent business leaders in the Coastal Bend. At the request of Bend publisher, Chris Knapick, provided him with names/contact info of local prominent veterans

Attended informal meeting on future options for South Texas USO and agreed to contact new NASCC Commanding Officer, CAPT Ty Jurica to discuss how to improve support to his enlisted military families.

Attended joint meeting of Corpus Christi City Council and City Planning Commission meeting Tuesday, 9 August and spoke in favor of proposed

Compatibility Overlay Districts for area military airfields. The amendment passed.

Attended planning meeting with UCCCC and REDC CEO, 8 AUG on next steps for Chief of Naval Air Training Quarters on NASCC

Received inquiry from CNATRA staffer on Corpus Christi Airport Parking fees for active military. According to the Texas DMV website, Air Medal (and Air with Valor Medal) plates should receive free parking and apparently CRP does not have the same policy. Airport Officials quickly responded positively to support this change.

Received inquiry from KRIS Channel 6 reporter on future potential of relocating Cabaniss Outlying Air Field. I declined to be interviewed and mentioned that our Task Force is divided on this issue.

Held STMTF Quarterly Meeting at Ortiz Center. Attendees included new Commanding Officers from CCAD and NASK. Meeting agenda included a report out from the TF's recent visit to Washington.

Presented STMTF and hosted luncheon at meeting with Navy Assistant Secretary, the Honorable Sandra Klien. The meeting attended by Mayor/City Manager of Kingsville, County Judges from Nueces and Kleberg County, and City of Corpus Christi Representatives focused on Energy Resiliency and our area military installations.

As member of the Texas Governor's Military Support Committee attended meeting on 18 August to review proposed legislation supporting the military across Texas.

Received a "Thank You" from the Mayor and City Representatives for supporting the recently (successfully passed) amendment to the City Unified Development Code (UDC) to adopt Military Compatibility Overlay Districts for area military airfields.

Attended Mayor's Interagency Meeting hosted by at Corpus Christi Boy's and Girl's Club on Friday 2 Sep.

Received inquiry from Army Aviation Association of America for STMTF to Cohost (with the City) the Networking Mixer at this Year's Luther Jones Aviation summit meeting in December at the Ortiz Center. Cost will be \$1,250.

Met with Chief Financial Officer of CCAD, Marcia Bischak, in how STMTF can support future CCAD projects.

Contacted AEP's new External Affairs Manager, Natalie Villarreal and provided her with an overview of the STMTF and thanked her for AEP's financial support.

Arranged visits and tours (with Texas Military Values Task Force Member, Dave Edgecomb and Texas Military Preparedness Commissioner, Gary Bradford) of Naval Air station's Corpus Christi and Kingsville set for 26 and 27 September.

Received invitation from National Security Innovation Council (NSIC) to meet/greet Kemba Walden, Principal Deputy for Cyber for the White House in Austin on 22 SEP.

Reviewed article received from Tom Tagliabue on infrastructure funding challenges for Navy Installations. Article is accurate and alarming. Looking at NASCC and NASK, It is not hard to see the results when annual required maintenance is funded at 25 to 50% - continuing degradation.

Received good news from the Texas Governor's office of new Defense Economic Adjustment Assistance Grant (DEAAG) awards to Kingsville and Corpus Christi. The funds will be invested in infrastructure projects and other initiatives to increase the value of our area military installations as well as protecting jobs in our area:

- City of Corpus Christi: Awarded \$1,611,159 for Wastewater Collection System Line and Manhole Replacement at NAS Corpus Christi
- City of Kingsville: Awarded \$1,700,000 for Kingsville Fire & Rescue Facility at NAS Kingsville

Supported efforts that resulted in Kolda Elementary School being awarded a Purple Heart Designation school. At Kolda Elementary School, almost a tenth of the student population — have a parent serving active duty in the military. Numerous others have family connections to veterans.

Had discussion with County Judge Canales on how to have a smooth transition of County related STMTF activity to incoming Judge Connie Scott.

Arranged a tour of the NASCC Base theater to view firsthand the poor condition on this historic building and develop plans of action to bring this facility back into operation. Invited Congressman Cloud's District Manager, Mark Longoria to attend as well.

Responded to Disk Messbarger who provided information on a meeting he had with CNATRA about ongoing concerns with the lack of adequate flag level housing on NASCC. Updated Dick on local community activity and support underway to provide new CNATRA housing and invited he and the Kingsville Navy supporters to join our efforts.

Attended Army Aviation Association of America's Luther Jones Depot Forum on 6 December. Presented an STMTF update to over 400 attendees and attended the networking mixer co-hosted by STMTF and the City.
