2013 STATE LEGISLATIVE PRIORITIES

STATUS (as of 5/19/13)
All windstorm reform bills except SB 1702 did not pass.
\SB 1702 by Bonnen/Taylor – On House Calendar 5/20/13.
Helps policy holders who are having problems with the waiver provisions regarding WPI 8s and 12s and
the need to extend this waiver which is set to expire shortly. Allowing it to expire will cost almost 20,000
policy holders on the Texas Coast their ability to maintain windstorm insurance.
