Accepting and appropriating a grant for the Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force program

CAPTION:

Ordinance authorizing the City Manager or designee to execute all documents necessary to accept a grant from the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Internet Crimes Against Children (ICAC) Task Force program, in the amount of \$19,800 to purchase equipment, supplies, and training travel for the ICAC program within the Police Department; and appropriating the \$19,800 in the No. 1061 Police Grants Fund.

BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:

The Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention Internet Crimes against Children Task Force program has approved a grant for the Corpus Christi Police Department Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. The Police Department has been a member of the ICAC since 2003. These funds will be used for the purchase of equipment, supplies, and training travel. There is no match required by the City. Funds are available from December 1, 2014 through May 31, 2015.
