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UDC Text Amendment Exempting RTA Signs that Contain Commercial Advertising

## **CAPTION:**

Ordinance amending the Corpus Christi Unified Development Code by revising subsection 7.5.7.A.7 relating to signs partially exempt from the UDC; providing for severance, penalties, and publication.

## **PURPOSE:**

This ordinance is presented as an effort to ensure compliance and improve the quality and effectiveness of the UDC.

#### **BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:**

The Unified Development Code was adopted in July 2011. Since that time, staff has worked with the public and stakeholders groups to correct and amend the code as needed to ensure a safe and development friendly community.

This item proposes an amendment to Section 7.5.7.A.7, Signs Partially Exempt from Code, specifically signs installed by a transit company with a franchise or other right to operate in the City such as the Regional Transportation Authority (RTA).

The City of Corpus Christi and the RTA executed an agreement on November 26, 1985, in which the Authority and the City agree that the Authority shall be responsible for any and all advertising placed on passenger shelters, benches or bus stop signs located within public right-of-way or easements maintained by the City . . ." Under the UDC, many of these signs are considered off-premise signs, similar to a billboard, and are not allowed. This proposed amendment will provide for the effectiveness of the previously executed agreement and current lease agreement between the Regional Transportation Authority and the City of Corpus Christi.
