“Unearth a Story”



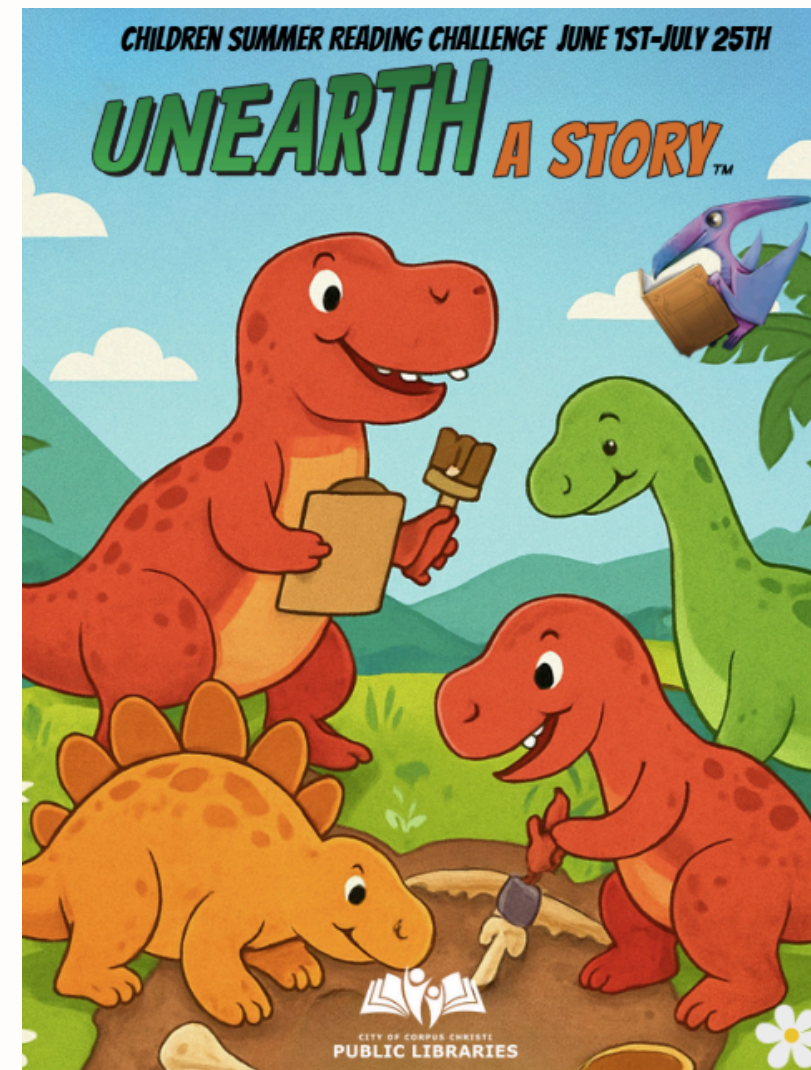
Introduction:

Components

- To Participate

 - Registration is required to receive a booklet
- Two Types of Booklets
 - Children
 - Tween/Teen



Booklet Structure



- Three checkout cards
- Library program challenge
- Reading challenge
- Upon completion of the booklet, they will be entered into the completion prize drawings and given an instant mystery prize

Checkout Cards

Participants will check out books from the library to earn stamps to complete checkout cards and to be entered into a drawing.

Below are the values for one stamp:

- Five picture books, board books and/or easy readers
- One juvenile or teen chapter book
- One juvenile non-fiction or graphic novel

After completing checkout card three participants can continue filling out extra checkout cards to earn additional entries into the drawings.
