CORPUS CHRISTI, Texas, April 13, 2026 – *The following statement was released today by the Corpus Christi Professional Firefighters Association, IAFF Local 936:*

Corpus Christi firefighters deliver excellent service, are good stewards of city resources, and we give back to the community. We are committed to monitoring local political controversies that can affect our ability to deliver on these commitments.

In the case of Mayor Paulette Guajardo, Corpus Christi firefighters are grateful for all the mayor has done to further strengthen our fire department and public safety in our community. The Mayor has often shown real leadership on these issues when the city needed it most. For firefighters who protect this city every day, she has been a trustworthy partner in local government. Her record of listening and leading with resolve has kept the city moving in the right direction.

With the fire service in Corpus Christi, Mayor Guajardo:

- She has led the fight for the implementation of the national safety standard of four-person staffing on fire department trucks. She continues to work with the fire chief, ensuring that the plan is sustainable and provides better fire coverage at incidents,
- Gained city council approval of local redirection of federal government-funded ambulance services resources, saving taxpayers millions of dollars,
