Motion to Determine if City Staff is to Evaluate a Business Proposal for Future Brackish Water Supply as Developed by Seven Seas Water Group.

Motion to Determine if City Staff is to Evaluate a Business Proposal for Future Brackish Water Supply as Developed by Seven Seas Water Group.

**SUMMARY:**

This proposed motion, if approved, would authorize City Staff to evaluate a forthcoming proposal to develop a future brackish water supply by Seven Seas Water Group.

**BACKGROUND AND PURPOSE:**

Seven Seas Water Group is a multinational company that develops, owns, and operates decentralized water and wastewater treatment plants and related businesses. It is headquartered in Tampa and Houston and has operations across the U.S., Caribbean and Latin America. The company provides water and wastewater treatment services to governmental, municipal, industrial, and hospitality customers and owns more than 200 water and wastewater treatment plants.

The brackish groundwater project is to be developed on the large land area southeast of Corpus Christi. This project would deliver a minimum of 10 million gallons a day (MGD) of drinking water with expectations of up to 20 MGD. The final size of the project will be dictated by aquifer testing which will inform the long-term sustainable production possible from this portion of the aquifer.

Seven Seas has completed the land agreement. A hydrogeologic study and investigation will be required to evaluate the merits of the potential project site. No staff hours will be expected on the development of this business proposal.

The Council previously authorized staff to work with STWA and Seven Seas Water Group on a brackish reverse osmosis project in Nueces County.

**ALTERNATIVES:**

Proposals for new water supply projects are very complex and have varying levels of cost, delivery time frames, and challenges associated with them. This process will allow staff to properly evaluate a potential project plan.

**FISCAL IMPACT:**

No fiscal budget impact at this time.

**RECOMMENDATION:**

Staff requests Council to provide direction to review any further forthcoming water supply business proposal as developed by Seven Seas Water Group.
