

Resolution authorizing a five-year service agreement with AT&T Enterprises, LLC, of Dallas, in the amount of \$2,363,674.10 for upgraded 9-1-1 services and the necessary phone lines, support, and maintenance, with FY 2025 funding of \$153,960.23 from the Proposition 8 Broadband Infrastructure Grant Fund.

WHEREAS, the Corpus Christi Police Department needs the emergency services IP network ("ESInet") provided by AT&T to deliver emergency services;

WHEREAS, State law provides that such procurements, as outlined above, are subject to statutory procurement requirements, including competitive bids, unless an exemption applies;

WHEREAS, there is a statutory exemption for this procurement in Texas Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a)(7)(A), as these services are available from only one source because of patents, copyrights, secret processes, or natural monopolies; and

WHEREAS, there is a second statutory exemption for this procurement in Texas Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a)(2), as this purchase is necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the municipality's residents.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Corpus Christi, Texas:

Section 1. The City Council specifically finds that the foregoing statements included in the preamble of this resolution are true and correct and adopts such findings for all intents and purposes related to the authorization of this procurement.

Section 2. The City Manager, or his designee, is authorized to execute a five-year agreement with AT&T Enterprises, LLC, for upgraded 9-1-1 emergency phone services, lines, support, and maintenance in an amount not to exceed \$2,363,674.10, with FY 2025 funding of \$153,960.23 from the Proposition 8 Broadband Infrastructure Grant Fund.
