FY27 Selective Traffic Enforcement Program

Background Information

The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) provides grant funding to cities in Texas for the Selective Traffic Enforcement Project (STEP).

The STEP program reimburses cities for overtime activities carried out by local law enforcement organizations in an effort to reduce vehicle crashes. The STEP program helps to reduce vehicle crashes by having local law enforcement organizations focus on traffic enforcement efforts in high vehicle crash areas.

The City of Corpus Christi is requesting \$107,728.00.



Background Information

This grant will provide funding for:

The Police Department will use the funds received from this grant to provide approximately 1,650 hours of overtime funding to sworn officers for additional enforcement for DWIs, speed violations, and distracted driving across Corpus Christi.

The efforts will take place on varying days of the week and hours of operation.

Background Information

This grant is for a one-year period beginning on October 1, 2026, through September 30, 2027.

CCPD has received this grant for over 20 years. Last year, the City received \$106,064.00 from this grant program.

The City is required to have a 21% match.
