

Project and Financing Plan and Allowable Uses

Project and Financing Plan

Project and Financing Plan defines the allowable uses of the funds

- Plan should be a living document
- Should be updated to reflect the current needs of the TIRZ area
- Plan can be amended at any time with recommendation of the TIRZ Board and the approval of City Council

Allowable Uses

Infrastructure and improvements that benefit the TIRZ zone and would not otherwise occur "but for" creation of the zone:

- Public infrastructure
- Public improvements
- Capital maintenance of public infrastructure
- Reimbursement to private parties that make improvements
- Programs or other projects that benefit the zone

Identified Needs

Ongoing Packery Channel maintenance

Improved amenities within the TIRZ

Stormwater, Water and Wastewater infrastructure

Mobility, connectivity, walkability

Environmental conservation/preservation

Quality entertainment and retail infrastructure

Water circulation and quality

Revenue

Current Available Balances

- FY2022 ending operating fund balance is \$8.1M
- FY2023 Revenue totals \$5.9M for a current ending fund balance of \$14.0M
- \$500K reserved for maintenance of Packery Channel
 - Prior board reserved \$500K of the existing fund balance specifically for maintenance of Packery Channel
 - Staff recommends releasing this reserve since there is funding totaling \$36.4M specifically allocated for ongoing maintenance of Packery Channel in the Project and Financing Plan
- CIP fund has \$4.0M allocated and available for dredging once repairs to the channel infrastructure is completed

Future Development

<u>Whitecap Preserve</u> \$800 million over 10 years

Lake Padre \$700 million over 12 years

Other potential projects \$500 million over 5-10 years

\$2 Billion in investment expected over the next 12 years

Revenue

- During the original term of the TIRZ the City contributed 100% of the tax revenue generated above the base year which totaled \$58M over 20 years.
- All other participating tax entities which included Nueces County and Nueces County Hospital District contributed 100% of the tax revenue also.
- Nueces County Hospital District is unable to continue participating due to change in State law.
- For the extension Nueces County has already reduced their participation to 75% for year 1-5, a reduction of 5% per year for years 6-10, and then continuing with 50% for years 11-20.

Revenue Considerations

- Contribution percentage should support current and future needs and projects and not accumulate excess revenues. Once all projects included on the project and financing plan are completed the TIRZ automatically expires.
- Due to changes from Senate Bill 2, the value of the increment created in the TIRZ is treated as existing value which is subject to the 3.5% limitation for the tax rate calculation.
 - Need to have a planned exit strategy to step down the contribution percentage so the City's tax rate will not be adversely affected
