Jay Gardner spoke on this topic. He stated he has viewed the design plans which are at 90% complete. He gave information on the upcoming Flour Bluff Citizens Council meeting. The following topics were discussed:

4. [26-0364](#) Resolution Exempting the Parks & Recreation Advisory Committee from the Prohibition of Recommending Potential Committee Appointments

It has been determined that PRAC is interested in having more involvement recommending/vetting potential Committee members to Council during the election process. There has been a high turnover rate in recent years and PRAC would like to be excluded from the prohibition of reviewing/selecting potential members. PRAC feels that having more input in the election process could help better serve the community. Vice Chair Cronnon volunteered to draft a sample resolution for PRAC's review/action at the next meeting on May 13, 2026.

5. [26-0363](#) Discussion Regarding the Parks & Recreation 10-Year Master Plan

Staff informed the Committee that the 10-Year Parks & Recreation Master Plan was adopted in 2022 and that a mid-way review of the plan must take place at the "5-year" mark which should occur in 2027 per the Texas Parks & Wildlife Department. PARD's top three priorities are shade structures, playgrounds and trails as these are areas where grant funding is most available. PARD is preparing to focus on the parks within each Council District that could benefit from minor improvements that make a big impact. PARD is also reviewing the grading system within the Master Plan as some park grades may need to be reevaluated. No action was taken on this item.
