RPP Overview



- Originally known as the Infrastructure Management Plan (IMP)
- Established in 2020 as a 5-year scheduled program for street improvements
- In April 2023 Council approved a pavement only reconstruction approach for residential streets.
- In June 2023 the FY 2024 2028 IMP was approved by Council
- In November 2023 the IMP was rebranded as the RPP
- Proposed Residential RPP Plan FY 2027 2031 was developed based on a funding level of \$31 Million.
- Continue with current SPMP Plan FY 2024 2028 until funding is confirmed



RPP Overview cont'd



The RPP consists of three programs that are executed as either Contractual or Non-Contractual:

- Contractual Pavement Restoration
 - Street Preventative Maintenance Program (Arterial/Collector)
 - Residential Street Rebuild Program (Residential)
 - Non-Contractual Pavement Restoration
 - In-House Pavement Rehabilitation (Residential)

RPP Funding Shortfall (Residential Streets) Mileage/year vs. RPP Funding







Recommendation



- Approve the FY 2027-2031 RPP Proposed Plan
 - Developed based on a funding level of \$31 Million for Residential streets
 - Approximately 31 CL miles/year
 - 2027 and 2028 plan are replanned as complete neighborhood clusters up to 2029
 - 2030 and 2031 will prioritize and address the worst streets with the lowest PCI scores ranging from 0-20 while utilizing a neighborhood cluster approach
- Continue with current SPMP Plan FY 2024 2028 until funding is confirmed
