a. <u>ANIMAL CONTROL ADVISORY COMMITTEE</u> — One (1) vacancy representing: 1 - member of a local Animal Welfare organization, which operates an Animal Shelter with term to 5-31-14.

**DUTIES**: To advise the City Council and City Manager on all aspects of animal control including fees, staffing, ordinances, procedures and policies and facilities. The jurisdiction and actions of the Board shall be advisory only.

**COMPOSITION:** It shall consist of seven (7) members. Terms will be for three years. At least one member shall be a veterinarian. Two members shall be members of local animal welfare organizations (at least one of the organizations must operate an animal shelter). The remaining four members shall represent the community at large. All members shall serve until their successors are appointed and qualified and each shall be a resident of the City. The City Manager, or his representative, the Director of the City-County Health and Welfare Department or his representative and the Animal Control Supervisor shall serve as ex-officio members of the Board without vote. The Board, by majority vote, shall elect its own Chairman who shall preside at all meetings of the Board and a Vice Chairman who shall act as president in the absence of the Chairman. The Director of the City-County Health and Welfare Department or his designated representative shall serve as the secretary of the Board.
