The Bays Plan seeks to ensure that the Coastal Bend bays and estuaries remain a vibrant part of the region's environmental and economic landscape. # History



The Coastal Bend Bays and Estuary Program (CBBEP) is an interlocal agency non-profit 501(c)(3), established in 1999 as a non-regulatory, voluntary, partnership effort between stakeholders in the Nueces-San Antonio Coastal, Nueces River and Nueces-Rio Grande Basins. The Mission of CBBEP is to protect the Coastal Bend Bays and Estuaries through the implementation of the Coastal Bend Bays Plan.



# Board of Directors



---

The Coastal Bend Bays and Estuary Program (CBBEP) Board of Directors includes the Mayor of Corpus Christi, County Judges from Nueces and San Patricio Counties, the Port of Corpus Christi, Port Industries and others as appointed by the board.

State and federal agencies as well as citizens, college and university scientist participate in implementation teams develop and implement projects that are beneficial to the community.



# City Partnerships



The City of Corpus Christi will continue to provide annual funding of \$75,000 to partner with CBBEP on projects including those benefiting water supply and freshwater inflows, environmental indicator reports, Oso Bay Wetlands Preserve, Stormwater Runoff and Bacteria Source Tracking, and Habitat Restoration and Protection.

The fiscal impact to the FY 2022 Storm Water Fund is \$37,500.00.
