Advisory Report - last 3 months

Miguel Escobar went over the February 2023/2024 Comparison Shelter Report with the Board. Ms. Cardenas inquired about left to rescue numbers, Mr. Escobar explained rescue partners are a 5013c with a MOU to pull animals from us. Mr. Dominguez inquired if there was a particular zip code the Public Safety dogs are from, at this time there is not Ms. McCollough inquired if we could get the Intake Subtype on the Comparison Report for the next meeting. Mr. Perkins inquired on the criteria for euthanasia. Mr. Escobar advised the sick, injured, public safety and for length of stay. Ms. Cardenas inquired on hard date animals being posted on social media. Ms. Burbage explained that city communication advised against posting hard date animals on CCACS social media but Trello where they are posted is open to the public via a link as well as 24petconnect where all animals in the shelter are posted. Ms. Burbage also explained the city is also updating our website. The Board discussed a motion to address City Council as a committee about allowing the hard date animals on social media. Ms. McCollough inquired on the microchip in the field section being blank, if that meant there were none or a possible issue with the report. Mr. Escobar advised it could be a reporting issue and look into it. Mr. Dominguez inquired on the increase of number of citations issued, Mr. Escobar attributed to the increase of numbers of calls and violations being issued as needed. Ms. McCollough inquired on resources offered to the public, Mr. Escobar advised citizens are referred to PAAC and Gulf Coast for assistance. Ms. Cardenas inquired about getting the number of calls completed added to the shelter report. Mr. Escobar advised the Board to vote to add to the shelter report. Ms. McCollough inquired on the follow-up if any on the compliance once a citation has been issued. Mr. Escobar advised due to the number of calls of service we have there is not a follow-up til if and when there is another call for service made. For spay/neuters, our partners report back to CCACS advise which referrals received services. Ms. Cardenas inquired on TNR Services with Melissa Lincoln being funded by the city. Ms. Cardenas was advised Ms. Lincoln is not funded by the city, she is a rescue, a 5013c. Ms. Lincoln can apply for grants but does not have one through the city. Ms. Cardenas inquired about those who cannot afford spay/neuters. Ms. McCollough explained that Gulf Coast gives vouchers to those in need. Ms. McCollough expressed her concern on the live release numbers and length of stay euthanasia numbers as it is reflecting number of animals being euthanized for space.

G. Unfinished Business

Ms. Burbage advised we were taking dogs to PAAC to assist with spay/neuters. The vacant positions in the clinic are now filled resulting in an increase in house spay/neuter. Ms. Cardenas inquired about the process when an animal leaves unaltered during an adoption. Ms. Burbage explained the adopter is issued a Sterilization order that is issued, and the adopter has to provide proof of spay/neuter in 30 days. Ms. Force added some animals may be sick, injured, underweight and not eligible for spay/neuter at CCACS at the time of adoption
