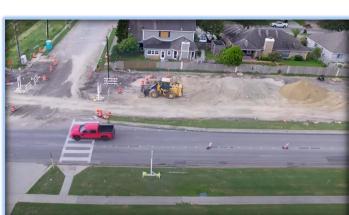

AMERICAN BANK CENTER ARENA

1/8 cent is currently authorized for the construction of the Arena, capital projects, and operational needs of the Arena

DOWNTOWN SEAWALL

1/8 cent is currently authorized for the major improvements made to the Downtown Seawall, capital projects, and operational needs

Proposition E: Purpose #1 Arterial & Collector Streets

City-wide improvements to arterial and collector streets which support commercial activity.

Initial Proposed Arterial & Collector Projects	Estimated Project Cost
Lower Broadway St. (Cooper's Alley to Twigg St.)	\$10.0M
Yorktown Boulevard	\$4.0M
Alameda St. (Texan Trail to Doddridge Street)	\$20.5M

The proposed projects above were identified as priorities for the first 5 years of the 20-year reauthorization. The proposed projects and estimated costs are preliminary and subject to change.







Proposition E: Purpose #2 Recreational & Community Facilities

Infrastructure improvements to City-owned recreational and community facilities within the Sports, Entertainment, and Arts (SEA) District including the American Bank Center Complex.

Proposed Infrastructure Improvements Include:

- Replacement of critical operations equipment
- Struct ral repairs & drainage improvements

District Facilities include the ABC Complex, Texas State Museum of Asian Cultures, Art Museum of South Texas, Corpus Christi Museum of Science & History, and the Harbor Playhouse





Each purpose will be allocated 50% of the 1/8 cent allocation which is expected to collect around \$200 million dollars over the 20-year term.

Proposition F: Purpose #1 Downtown Seawall

Reauthorize the use for the Downtown Seawall including infrastructure improvements pertaining to the downtown seawall control structures.

Includes maintenance and improvements for:

- Primary seawall structure
- Breakwater
- Salt Flat Levee
- T and L Head land masses
- Flood control pumps

Note: Excludes any vertical structures or amenities that do not support the items above or pertain to flood control.





Proposition F: Purpose #2 City-wide Flood Control & Drainage Projects

City-wide stormwater, flood control, drainage, and coastal resiliency projects.

Williams Ditch	Channel and storm drain improvements.
Oso Creek Channel	Channel improvements.
