### **Ordinance Violations**



Ordinance violations as of December 22, 2021:

- Cases to schedule: 12,387
- Number of people: 3,604



## Results of Ordinance Violation Cases Addressed



- Approximately 14,000 cases for ordinance violations were scheduled from October 4, 2021 to present
  - People scheduled: 3,274
  - People who appeared: 293




## Results of Ordinance Violation Cases Addressed

8,590



- ❖ Cases addressed: 12,456 / 89.4%
  - Warrants issued: 6,088
  - Pending warrants: 2,502
  - Cases resolved: 475

  - Cases reset: 867



Cases with no status change: 1,477 / 10.6%



# New Ordinance Violations Filed and Failure to Comply Violations



- New violations pending: Thirteen (13) filed since February 15, 2022
- Failure to Comply (FTC) violations requiring a hearing: 86



### 2022 Warrant Roundup



#### Warrant Roundup Amnesty period:

- ❖ February 14 February 25, 2022
  - ➤ Warrants cleared: 1,737
  - > Total collected: \$501,798
  - People entered the court: 1,890

#### **Warrant Roundup:**

- ❖ February 26 March 5, 2022
  - Warrants cleared: 638
  - > Total collected: \$385,947
  - People arrested: 24
  - > Warrants cleared by arrest: 100
  - People entered the court: 1,151

#### **TOTAL:**

- 2,375 Warrants cleared
- ◆ \$887,745 Collected
- ❖ 3,041 People entered the court



### **COVID-19 Protocols**



- Per the Presiding Judge, Municipal Court will continue to follow social distancing in the courtrooms
- Mask mandate will also be required in the courtrooms
- COVID-19 protocols may change April 1, 2022 with expiration of 47<sup>th</sup> Texas Supreme Court Emergency Order
