- > City Council Directed Staff to:
 - ✓ Develop an Appeals Process
 - ✓ Review the impact of non-profit entities for further Fee consideration

Street Maintenance Fee – Ordinances

- Ordinance 1 Amends the Code of Ordinances, codifying the Street Maintenance Fee under a new Article XX, Chapter 55 Utilities, titled Street Preventative Maintenance Program.
- Ordinance 2 Amends the Code of Ordinances, establishing a Street Maintenance Fee Appeals Board.
- Ordinance 3 Amends the Code of Ordinances by adopting an appeal process related to the billing of the Street Maintenance Fee.

- Utility Business Office (UBO)
 - ✓ Primary Point of Contact for Customers
- Street Maintenance Fee Appeals Board -
 - ✓ 5 members:
 - ACM over Finance
 - Director of Street Operations
 - Director of Water or Wastewater
 - Two (2) Citizens appointed by the City Manager

- > Residential Customers:
 - ✓ May Contest
 - Residency OCL/ICL Status
 - Active Water Meter Status
 - ✓ May Request
 - Low Income Discount

> Low Income Discount -

- ✓ Reduced Rates for Low Income
- ✓ Emulates City's "Operation Heat Help" Program
- ✓ Residents Must Provide Proof of Eligibility
- ✓ Low Income Status Must Be Validated Annually
- √ 15.2% Households Receive Food Stamps
 - √ (2010 Census for Corpus Christi)
 - ✓ Equals Approximately \$500K Loss

- ➤ Non Residential Customers :
 - ✓ May Contest
 - Residency OCL/ICL Status
 - ✓ May Appeal
 - Square Footage (SF)
 - Land Use Designation
 - Multi-Meter/ Single Business SF Cap Application
 - Number of Active Water Meters

- > UBO Resolution Officer
 - ✓ Receives & Reviews Appeal
 - ✓ Coordinates with other Departments
 - ✓ Develops Recommendation
 - ✓ Appeal Approved
 - Records Updated
 - Bill Adjusted
 - ✓ Appeal Denied
 - Appeal Request can be made by customer
 - Forward to Street Maint. Fee Appeals Board

- > Appeals Require Processing
 - √ Square Footage (SF) -
 - Customers will be directed to file appeal with Nueces County Appraisal District (NCAD)
 - ✓ Land Use Designation -
 - UBO will coordinate with Development Services
 - ✓ Multi-Meter/ Single Business SF Cap -
 - UBO will coordinate with Legal

Other Considerations – Non-Profit Utility Customers

- Current database does not identify non-profit status, only tax exempt status
- > 641 tax exempt metered accounts identified
- Further research is required to identify which tax exempt accounts are non-profit customers
- Estimates of revenue impact using tax exempt accounts:
 - ✓ @ 50% Discount \$310,408/yr. or 2.72%
 - ✓ @ 100% Discount \$620,816/yr. or 5.44%
