

Ordinance amending the City Code of Ordinances, Chapter 55, regarding 9-1-1 emergency service fees as of January 1, 2020

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That the City Code of Ordinances, Section 55-7, "Local exchange access line 9-1-1-service fee", Subsection (b), is amended to revise the fees as follows:

- (b) 9-1-1 emergency service fee.
Each service supplier in the city shall collect a 9-1-1 emergency service fee of ~~one dollar and twenty-five cents (\$1.25)~~ one dollar and sixty cents (\$1.60) per month for each residential local exchange access line; ~~one dollar and forty-five cents (\$1.45)~~ two dollars (\$2.00) per month for each business local exchange access line; and ~~one dollar and sixty cents (\$1.60)~~ two dollars and forty cents (\$2.40) per month for each business trunk local exchange access line. The 9-1-1 emergency service fee shall be used only for costs attributable to equipment and personnel necessary to operate the city's public safety answering point.

SECTION 2. Publication shall be made in the official publication of the City of Corpus Christi as required by the City Charter of the City of Corpus Christi. The changes to the 9-1-1 emergency service fees as reflected in this Ordinance take effect on January 1, 2020.
