

Ordinance approving the purchase of Harris Public Safety communication radios in an amount not to exceed \$3,567,032.20 to be used by the Corpus Christi Police Department from Dailey and Wells Communications, Inc.; appropriating \$1,189,010.73, from the unreserved fund balance of the General Fund initially budgeted in FY 2019 for this purpose but not encumbered; and amending the FY 2019-2020 operating budget to increase expenditures.

WHEREAS, this purchase of 770 portable and 40 mobile communication radios for Public Safety;

WHEREAS, State law provides that such procurements, as outlined above, are subject to statutory procurement requirements, including competitive bids, unless an exception applies;

WHEREAS, there is a statutory exception for this procurement in Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a) (2), as this purchase is necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the City's residents.

WHEREAS, there is a statutory exception for this procurement in Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a) (7) (D) a procurement of items that are available from only one source, due to captive replacement parts or components for equipment;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI, TEXAS:

Section 1. The funds in the amount of \$1,189,010.73 are appropriated from the unreserved fund balance in General Fund No 1020 for the purchase of Harris Public Safety communication radios from Dailey and Wells Communications, Inc.

Section 2. That the FY2019-2020 operating budget adopted by Ordinance No. 031870 is amended by increasing expenditures by \$1,189,010.73.

Section 3. The City Manager, or designee, is authorized to execute all documents necessary to purchase Harris Public Safety communication radios from Dailey and Wells Communications, Inc. on a three-year service agreement, for an amount not to exceed \$3,567,032.20.
