### Low-income Housing Tax Credits



- Low-income Housing Tax Credits (LIHTC) are the most common financing tool for multi-family affordable rental housing units
- Tax credits are awarded by the Texas Department of Housing and Community Affairs (TDHCA). The application process is <u>highly</u> competitive
- Corpus Christi is in Region 10/Urban which includes Nueces, Aransas, San Patricio, and Victoria counties. The region generally receives 1 award each year from the competitive process

### Low-income Housing Tax Credits



- For an application for LIHTCs to be competitive, developers request a Resolution of Support from the City
  - Resolutions of Support = 17 points
  - Resolution of No Objection = 14 points
- Developers may also request a letter regarding their proposed project's contribution to the City
  - City support given by letter; no City Council action required
  - 7 points available



## 2022 City Application for Resolutions



- Developers will submit a simple application
- To be recommended to Council for a Resolution, applications are required to:
  - Be complete
  - Be for projects where the development site meets current zoning requirements, or the project meets the land use identified in the applicable adopted Area Development Plan
- Recommendations for Resolutions will be presented to City Council with project details



#### Concerted Revitalization Plan Points



- To receive the letter of support for Concerted Revitalization Plan points, developers will submit a simple application to the City
- Concerted Revitalization Plan points are given by TDHCA when the project contributes to a community's revitalization as described in plans such as Area Development Plan, TIRZ and TIFS
- To be receive the letter applicants will be required to:
  - Submit the Concerted Revitalization Plan Packet required by TDHCA
  - Describe how the project contributes to the City's revitalization plans
