Amendment to the Corpus Christi Code to add section 55-40 to authorize the Building Official to Disconnect Utility Services for Revocation of Certificate of Occupancy or to Remedy a Code Violation

City Council March 22, 2022

Background

Current City Code provides for utility disconnection:

- Delinquent payment of water and wastewater fees
- Under the International Building Code, limited to emergencies where the utility disconnection is necessary to eliminate an immediate hazard to life and property

Proposed amendment will expand Building Official's authority to disconnect utility services to a multifamily, commercial, institutional, or industrial building or structure for:

- Revocation of Certificate of Occupancy
- To remedy a code violation resulting in a danger to the life, health and safety of the public or the occupants of building.

City Code Amendment

Authorizes the Building Official to disconnect service utilities to a multifamily, commercial, institutional, or industrial building or structure regulated by a national model code adopted by the City when:

- A utility connection has been made without the required authorization;
- The Building Official has revoked a certificate of occupancy for the building or structure; or
- The Building Official finds:
- (a) the building or structure is in violation of a national model code adopted by the City and
- (b) the violation is a danger to the life, health, or safety of the public or the occupants of the building.

City Code Amendment

Prior to disconnection, the Building Official shall:

- Place visible notice on the front door of building/structure of the intent to disconnect utilities;
- Attempt to notify the owner of the building/structure of the decision to disconnect utilities;
- Give the owner at least 72 hours to remedy the deficiency; and
- Give the owner at least 72 hours to request a hearing before the Building Official and present evidence at the hearing.
