SUMMARY ECONOMIC IMPACTS

SPORTS TOURISM SECTOR

The sports tourism sector generated \$39.7 billion in direct spending in 2021, including spending by sports travelers and tournament operators. This spending generated a total economic impact of \$91.8 billion which supported 635,000 total jobs and generated \$12.9 billion in total tax revenues.








PROCESS

This strategic planning and facility audit project was conducted with the input of three members from the Consultant Team and included a 6-step process, including, but not limited to the following:

- In person and phone interviews with Corpus Christi area leaders.
- Electronic survey responses from VCC stakeholders.
- One (1) in-person town hall meeting with local stakeholders.
- Tours of 13 different sites that encapsulate 25 sports and event venues.
- Benchmarking against several high performing venues both regionally and nationally.
- A rating of VCC through the Sports Tourism Index[™] (a proprietary benchmarking tool developed by the Huddle Up Group, summarized in Appendix E).





- Feasibility study already completed
- Increase square footage of conference space
- Drawbacks
 - Price point
 - Community access




McGee Beach

- Lighting
- Infrastructure and amenities
 - Restrooms
 - Electrical hookups for P/A Systems and portable scoreboards
 - WiFi
 - Shade structures
- Sand quality



Baseball/Softball Complex

- Baseball field assessment conducted by the city in 2017 recommends Greenwood Park or Bill Witt Park
 - Propose Bill Witt Park
- Greenwood Park Bond
- At least 8 full-sized, turf baseball/softball diamonds with lights
- Industry best practices recommend turfing an entire field. This will allow each full-size field (300' + fences) to be turned into two youth fields.



Indoor Fieldhouse

- 8-12 courts for basketball that could then convert to 16-24 volleyball courts
- Proposed site Bill Witt Park
- Reasonable economic activity generated in a given calendar year:
 - \$10 million in Direct Visitor Spending
 - Hotel Occupancy Tax of \$225,000
 - Sales Tax over \$172,000
 - TPID Fees roughly \$50,000

- "Serves...essential recreation needs of City residents and serves as a community showcase for visitors." Pg. 135 Parks and Recreation 10-Year Master Plan
- Anchor-level Indoor Recreation Facility
- Anchor-level Baseball/Softball Complex
- 50m Pool
- Soccer field improvements
 - Field lights
 - On-site storage capability
 - WiFi
 - Concession stand
 - Park HQ
