


# Memorandum of Agreement

#### Hangar 1 History

- Constructed in 1961 using reinforced concrete; 20,000 sq ft hangar space and 8,000 sq ft office space.
- Functioned primarily as aviation hangar with office space on east side of airport until March 2020 when Signature Flight Support ceased operations.






### Hangar 1 Condition

- Hangar has been deemed unsafe and recommended for demolition.
  - Concrete cracked, spalling, falling from ceiling
  - Steel reinforcement corroded and weakened
  - Office space infested with mold and deteriorated due to exposure
