Fire Chief Robert Rocha will retire from the Corpus Christi Fire Department effective Friday, January 20.

I am appointing Deputy Chief Richie Quintero as Acting Fire Chief effective at 5:00 PM on Friday, January 20.

Chief Rocha was appointed Fire Chief of the Corpus Christi Fire Department (CCFD) in December 2011. Before his career in Corpus Christi, Chief Rocha retired from a 28-year career with the Kansas City Fire Department. Upon his appointment as Fire Chief for the City of Corpus Christi, Chief Rocha established a focus on firefighter safety, emergency response, and promoting diversity within the Fire Department.

Throughout his tenure with CCFD, Chief Rocha led several improvements within the Fire Departments and the City organization's responsiveness to emergency operations. Some of his significant accomplishments as the City of Corpus Christi Fire Department's Fire Chief are listed below.

- Implemented Mayor Guajardo's "Save our Seniors" home COVID vaccination program (which became a statewide model advocated by Governor Greg Abbott)
- 2. Provided safety during and recovery after Hurricane Harvey
- 3. Establishment of CCFD's drone program
- 4. Increase from 11 to 14 front-line medic units
- 5. Creation of the Nueces County Mutual Aid agreement for fire services
