AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 21, PART III BY ADDING NEW ARTICLE VI REGULATING THE USE OF PLASTIC CHECKOUT BAGS IN THE CITY OF CORPUS CHRISTI, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES



The Need

Plastic Bag Goals

- Reduce the number of plastic bags
- Create Education Program- "Keep it Clean, Corpus Christi!"

Expected Outcomes

- Reduction in plastic bags by 60% in Corpus Christi by 2015
- Increase reusable bag usage
- Overall decrease in litter
- Expand the market for recycling plastic bags

Green Star Program Elements

- Demonstrate 60% reduction
- Trash Receptacles
- Comprehensive Litter Plan
- Signage Requirements
- Reusable Bags
- Training Programs



Timelines

•Phase 1 – Public Education stage - September 1, 2013 to April 1, 2014: No restrictions to allow for Green Star registration, retailer change-over, consumer education, and in-store signage. Call for request for proposals for ad agency services.

•Phase 2 – Retailer Transition stage – October 2013 to December 2013: Mail out to all businesses outlining online registration process; monthly meetings will be held at area City facilities for Green Star Program tutorials and Chapter 21 Ordinance Education.

Phase 3- Consumer Transition stage -January 2014 to March 2014: Mass education campaign to include billboards, print, radio & television.
Phase 4 – Final stage - Beginning April 1, 2014: Single-use bags are prohibited from distribution without environmental recovery fees in place.
