

Ordinance authorizing the City Manager or designee to execute an Interlocal Agreement in the amount of \$31,192.80 with Texas A&M University – Corpus Christi for the development of an action plan to identify gaps in locally available programs and services to strengthen families and youth development; accepting and appropriating \$5,000 donation from Port Industries of Corpus Christi into the No. 1020 General Fund to be used by the City for payment of services provided under the Interlocal Agreement; and changing the FY 2014-2015 Operating Budget adopted by Ordinance number 030294 to increase revenues and expenditures each

Whereas, Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi desires to enter into an Interlocal Agreement with the City of Corpus Christi for the development of an action plan to identify gaps in locally available programs and services to strengthen families and youth development.

Whereas, the City of Corpus Christi desires to accept and appropriate a \$5,000 donation from Port Industries of Corpus Christi into the No. 1020 General Fund to be used by the City for payment of services provided under the Interlocal Agreement.

Now, therefore, be it ordained by the City Council of Corpus Christi, Texas, that:

Section 1. That the City Manager or designee is authorized to execute an Interlocal Agreement in the amount of \$31,192.80 with Texas A&M University-Corpus Christi for the development of an action plan to identify gaps in locally available programs and services to strengthen families and youth development. A copy of the Interlocal Agreement is on file in the City Secretary's office.

Section 2. That \$5,000 donation from Port Industries of Corpus Christi is accepted and appropriated into the No. 1020 General Fund to be used by the City for payment of services provided under the Interlocal Agreement.

Section 3. That the FY 2014-2015 Operating Budget adopted by Ordinance Number 030294 is hereby changed to increase revenues and expenditures by \$5,000 each.
