


Background

- April 27, 2017 City Council Workshop on New Residential Street Construction
 - Motion of Direction to revise the "duration of the materials and workmanship warranty for all private and public infrastructure improvements from one to two years from the date of final (100%) acceptance".
- May 17, 2017 Planning Commission approved staff recommendation of 2 year warranty.
- June 28, 2017 Planning Commission met and requested additional information from staff based on public comment.
- August 17, 2017 Building Code Board of Appeal recommended approval of 2 year warranty with maintenance bond.



Current Process





Data

<u>Pavement Condition Index</u> (PCI) is a numerical index between 0 and 100 which is used to indicate the general condition of a pavement. It is a statistical measure and requires survey of the pavement.

Staff reviewed 32 projects containing 172 public streets constructed between 2015-2016. PCI's ranged between 49-100

- 91% between 85-100 (Good condition)
- 7% between 71-84 (Seal Coat recommended)
- 2% between 56-70 (Overlay recommended)

PCI's are averaged over portions of existing and new pavement on street extensions.

Number of Project Warranty inspections during 2015-2016: 32

City performed utility/street repairs on 15% of projects reviewed between 2015-2016.



1-Year Warranty Inspection Findings















Current Municipal Policies

City of Corpus Christi – 1 year warranty (UDC Section 8.1.6.A)

City of Houston –1 year warranty with a Maintenance Bond of 100% surety of the contract price

City of San Antonio –1 year warranty with a Maintenance Bond of 10% of the construction estimate or \$ 25,000 which ever is greater

City of Galveston - 2 year warranty with a Maintenance Bond of 100% surety of the contract price



Staff Recommendation

Revise current 1 year warranty to a <u>2 year</u> warranty

Possible Alternate Considerations:

- Revise current 1-year warranty to include a maintenance bond
- Revise current 2-year warranty to include a maintenance bond
