De-Obligate Unused Grant Funds

CAPTION:

Motion to de-obligate a total amount of \$598,816.04, including \$98,816.04 from the Small Business Project grants left over from 2017-2018, which is made up of \$66,401.05 from the Del Mar College internship program and \$32,414.99 from the Texas A&M University – Corpus Christi internship program, and \$500,000 from the Sitel Business Incentive agreement and return the funds to the Type A Fund 1140.

PURPOSE:

De-obligate funds from unspent grants from projects and return to the Type A fund 1140.

BACKGROUND AND FINDINGS:

The Board passed the 2017-2018 budget on August 21, 2017 that included \$793,358 for Small Business Assistance programs.

At the end of 2017-2018 there is \$98,816.04 in unused grant money. The funds are not available for use after the agreements terminate. These funds should be de-obligated.

Sitel was approved for a grant of \$500,000 for creating jobs at their call center. They decided not to expand in this market and the agreement was terminated. This will de-obligate those funds.

OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:

This will allow the Board to use these funds for other projects.
