

UDC Text Amendments Unified Development Code (UDC) Certificate of Appropriateness

Overview

Purpose: Updating the Unified Development Code (UDC) to only require a Certificate of Appropriateness if the exterior of a historic building is being modified:

- Currently, the UDC requires a Certificate of Appropriateness (C of A) of any building permit or certificate of occupancy is requested.
- To obtain a C of A, the Landmark Commission must approve the work done to the building (30 days).



C of A Applicability

3.15.1 Applicability

A certificate of appropriateness shall be required in the following circumstances before the commencement of development within or work upon any designated landmark or contributing structure located within an Historic Overlay:

1. Whenever such work or development requires a building permit or certificate of occupancy; or

<u>1</u> 2. Whenever such work includes the erection, moving, demolition, reconstruction, restoration or alteration of the exterior of any landmark or structure.
