Ordinance authorizing a purchase of ten fiberglass lifeguard stands from Industrial Design Research, Inc. for a total amount of \$281,050.00 for Parks and Recreation to be used for the City's Bay and Gulf Beaches and funded by the State Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund; appropriating \$281,050.00 from the State Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund; and amending the budget to increase expenditures.

WHEREAS, fiberglass lifeguard stands are needed for the City's Beach Operations to be used by lifeguards at the Bay and Gulf Beaches;

WHEREAS, State law provides that such procurements, as outlined above, are subject to statutory procurement requirements, including competitive bids, unless an exception applies;

WHEREAS, there is a statutory exception for this procurement in Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a)(2) in that the procurement is necessary to preserve or protect the public health or safety of the City's residents; and

WHEREAS, there is a statutory exception for this procurement in Local Government Code, Section 252.022(a)(7) (A), as the items are available from only one source because of patents, copyrights, secret processes, or natural monopolies.

Now, therefore, be it resolved by the City Council of the City of Corpus Christi, Texas:

SECTION 1. The City Council specifically finds that the foregoing statements included in the preamble of this ordinance are true and correct and adopts such findings for all intents and purposes related to the authorization of this procurement.

SECTION 2. That funds in the amount of \$281,050.00 are appropriated from the unreserved fund balance in the No. 1032 State Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund for the purchase of fiberglass lifeguard stands from Industrial Design Research, Inc.

SECTION 3. That Ordinance No. 031870, which adopted the FY 2019-2020 Operating and Capital Budget, is amended to increase proposed expenditures in the No. 1032 State Hotel Occupancy Tax Fund by \$281,050.00 for the purchase of fiberglass lifeguard stands from Industrial Design Research, Inc.

SECTION 4. That the purchase of fiberglass lifeguard stands from Industrial Design Research, Inc., in the amount of \$281,050.00 is approved.
